

#### **Eco-schools**

As a school we are currently working towards achieving a green flag for our Eco-Schools award. Unfortunately, we have noticed a large amount of single use plastic being thrown away, especially plastic water bottles. Therefore, after the Christmas break the office will no longer be selling water bottles as we would like every child to be using a reusable water bottle daily. To help with this every child will receive a free water bottle to use (courtesy of Britvic) and will have your child's name written on it. We hope you will support us on our journey to reduce single use plastic!



<u>Year 2</u> made delicious gingerbread this week filling the kitchen area with a beautiful aroma. There have also been practical activities taken place in other year groups. Year 6 have even sewn their own stocking!

An increasing number of children bring **mobile phones** to school so their families have a way of contacting them whilst they are going to and from school. Unfortunately, we are finding they are not being used solely for this purpose, but for social media and video. We are concerned that children are less safe as they are 'on' their phones on the way to school and not paying close attention to what is happening around them. We also feel that there is increasing peer pressure on children to bring phones to school.

In order to prevent these issues, and after discussion with a group of families, we have decided that from January, the only phones that will be allowed in the school will be simple phones with no internet access or camera. These phones will still have to be handed into the Office on arrival and collected from the Office at the end of the day. A Nokia 105 is available from Amazon for approximately £15 and can be used for calls.
