Well done to those children who were awarded certificates.





















Year 4

Year 6 have researched their own topic of how something works on the Chrome books and made an explanation text about it. They are also preparing to move on to their new schools.




What is Beat the Street?

Beat the Street is a fun, free initiative that will see Leicester transformed into a giant game! See how far you can run, walk, cycle, scoot and roll in just 6 weeks and earn points for you and your school. There are great challenges to enjoy and prizes to be won. The game started on May 26th and ends on 7th July 2021.

All children have been given a map, a fob and a card. Children aged 11 and under play with a Beat the Street fob. Anyone aged 12 and above plays with a Beat the Street card. Create your account online and connect your fob to your account. Each player will need their own account. Use the <u>Beat Box map</u> to plan your route and get going!

Playing the Game

- 1. Find Beat Boxes nearest to you on the map.
- 2. Hover your card or fob in front of the Beat Box until it beeps and flashes.
- 3. Walk, cycle, run or scoot to a different Beat Box within an hour.
- 4. Swipe the Beat Box with your card and fob until it beeps and flashes to score 10 points.
- 5. Now carry on your journey and score more points for each extra Beat Box you swipe.



The teams at the top of the leaderboard at the end of the game win hundreds of pounds worth of vouchers. There are leaderboards for school & community teams. Children can also complete challenges and win certificates.
