We have been learning about winter and shapes and the children have been finding toys in ice and seeing it melt. Their cutting skills are getting really good too. Great work everyone!



Reception

We have been brushing our teeth, talking about what things are good for our teeth and who we should visit to help us with our teeth. We have also been writing about the book character 'Zog'. We have a lovely new vet themed role play area too and are learning about people who help us.



Year 1

As part of our Science lessons, we have been looking at the changes that happen during winter time and focussing on the weather and how the length of the day gets shorter. We have been making snowflakes, drawing winter pictures, painting penguins and ordering winter pictures. We have also enjoyed making our own eBooks.



Year 2

The children completed their second "Commando Joe" mission and were tasked with building shelters after 'escaping' the Great Fire of London. It was great to see the school's values being displayed by so many students: resilience when things went wrong; empathy for others in the group; and, of course, team work.





We have been using primary colours to create some beautiful artwork in the style of Piet Mondrian. We really enjoyed trying different fruits as part of our healthy eating topic in science. Many of us have discovered new flavours that we really enjoyed!



Year 3

We have been inspired by Giacometti and have designed our own foil sculptures capturing a movement. We have started a new science topic about forces and magnets and investigated how a toy car would travel on different surfaces and what friction is. In RE we discussed what we celebrate, how we celebrate and why this may be. Then we designed a new celebration or festival that we thought was worth celebrating once a year and explained why and how we should celebrate it. We came up with some excellent ideas!

Year 4


The children are thoroughly enjoying learning the recorder and are growing in confidence each week. They have also enjoyed using new drawing techniques with a variety of different pencils.

Montrose Character Values

This term, the children will be focusing on a new set of character values, using what they have learnt from RESPECT. This week they have been thinking about the term "caring" and what it means to be caring.

1S had a big discussion about who cares for them and they thought about the people or things they cared for and about. The children all took turns to offer tips and advice on how to look after animals and then they discussed how they could care for their friends.

Year 2 have been learning all about the importance of showing care. They discussed the importance of showing care to themselves, others and the world around them. It was fantastic to hear the children's plans to show even more care in and out of school: from helping at dinner times to picking up coats in the cloakroom, picking up litter to something as simple as giving someone a smile. They also read the book 'Kind' and learned about even more ways they could show kindness and care to themselves and others.

3C talked about who they care about. They discussed how they showed care to those people. They realised a lot of people in the class have family members who work for the NHS, and they remembered how they clapped for them to thank them for the care they provided in a tough time! To show their appreciation for those who care for them they made thankyou cards and wrote a lovely message inside.
