The children explored blending and shading with oil pastels after a hardworking week of writing riddles and looking at shapes. They have also been learning some African calland–response songs.




Year 3



We have also enjoyed researching facts about the Amazon river, practising how we can use the internet as a tool to help us find information.






Year 6
