### Year 1




We enjoyed every moment of our trip to Beaumanor Hall where we got to be pirates for the day. We searched for treasure on maps, completed pirate training activities and held water in goblets to test our sea legs as we balanced on tricky obstacles. We also tackled pirate themed maths quizzes.

This week we had the tricky task of ordering the instructions and reading each step to help us make pancake batter. We created some yummy pancakes and of course got to eat them! We also created our own instruction booklets on how to make pancakes.









We have also used watercolours to paint a background for a pirate ship.









We had brilliant fun learning how to make pancakes and they were delicious! We used this experience to practice writing instructions in our English lessons.







We braved the weather to measure objects on the playground! We enjoyed reading our favourite bedtime stories to the class on World Book Day.



#### Year 4

We discovered the effects of various drinks on our teeth. We used hard-boiled eggs to represent our teeth as their shell is similar to enamel and made predictions for what we thought would happen to the eggs if left for a week in 7 different liquids. We found that some shells had gone soft and slimy, some had changed in colour, others had gone bumpy and had started to dissolve and some had dissolved completely! We related this to our teeth and the importance of drinking some drinks in moderation and making sure we brush our teeth properly every day to brush away the sugar and plaque that builds up can cause damage if left.





We also did an experiment where we brushed one egg in toothpaste before leaving it in a cup of cola. We compared it to the egg that was just left in coke and found that the toothpaste had protected the tooth to some degree, stopping major colour discolouration. So definitely worth brushing your teeth with toothpaste!



This term's History topic is looking at Aylestone's Local history. We began by looking at maps from the last 200 years to see what has changed.

We have also enjoyed our latest two Commando Joe missions. In the first mission, we were trying to break world records e.g. how quick can we run 100m. In the second mission, we imagined we had broken machinery in the Arctic and had to travel across the delicate ice and try not to fall. We had to work well as a team in order to complete the mission.

We also painted some pictures from our class story, 'The House of Light'.























We had a fantastic trip to the Warning Zone, which is a Leicester based charity dedicated to delivering life-saving messages to children aged 10-11, as they transition to secondary school. In the next year they will meet new friends, be introduced to new experiences, gain more independence and be responsible for the actions, behaviours and decisions they make, both in their day to day life and online. The children thoroughly enjoyed the visit and will hopefully use what they learnt to stay safe, both online and out in the real world.

We practised our speeches and then some of us performed them to the rest of the class. We worked really hard, and showed real effort.
