In maths, we have learnt all about measures including mass and capacity and, just as it's getting colder again, we are learning how to read temperature using a thermometer. As the term comes to an end, we have finished our PSHE work on road safety and medicines and are looking forward to the Easter break.



Year 3

We have had pests come and vandalise our classroom and we have been writing newspaper reports about this. We are writing persuasive letters to Mr Owens to encourage him to bring his dog in to scare the pests away! In maths, we've been learning about length, mass and capacity. We've learned a lot about forces and magnets in Science and have also managed to squeeze in some singing practice in preparation for our production next term.



Year 4

The children carried out the next Commando Joe mission! This time it was based around a Norse explorer called Leif Erikson. The first task involved sticking together as a team in longboats and trying to navigate icebergs and sharks in the sea, whilst also avoiding the large waves (many got swept away and had to start again! Great perseverance shown!). Then they encountered a cyclone where visibility was poor (eye masks were worn!) and had to use their excellent communication skills to guide their teammate to safety. After that, they had to try and stay on the path in the dense forest (wild animals got them if they strayed off the path!) whilst listening to King Olaf's instructions carefully for the order they needed to be in. They finished by reflecting on which of their classmates they spotted who worked well and demonstrated the Commando Joe R.E.S.P.E.C.T values; it was lovely to hear a large variety of children's names put forward. Well done all!



Year 5

We have been learning about the Vikings and had a Viking day where we got to dress up. There were some terrific costumes, lots of educational games and activities and even an opportunity to play an old Viking board game. Mr Pearce also smashed a melon with an axe, which went everywhere! We also got to learn about Viking food and try some oat biscuits with jam and fruit!

In music, we learned about acapella singing from Xhosaspeaking people of Southern Africa, and had a go along with playing the chords for the song on glockenspiels.





Year 6

We visited De Montfort University in Leicester to take part in an Inspire Day. We took part in some activities, got to talk to current DMU students and had a tour of the university. This was a great opportunity for the children to see what a university is like.

The children have also taken part in an Enterprise Week at school, polishing up their business skills to raise money towards the cost of the bus journey. They worked so well in teams and showed fantastic entrepreneurial skills. Even after Mr Owens' startup fee has been returned, and they have still made a profit!
