Year 2

The children have investigated the properties of different materials in science, learned about the continents and oceans in geography and explored the lives of Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole in history. We also learned about the Plague and we have been so impressed with the amount of knowledge that the children are able to retrieve each week! At the end of the term, the children put on a wonderful production called the Inn-Spectors and we are pleased to announce that it was rated outstanding by the KS1 teachers!

Year 3

We have had a wonderful term in Year 3. We recently went on a trip to Bradgate Park as part of our Stone Age History topic. We got to imagine what life would have been like all those years ago. We were able to watch the rocksteady concert that happened recently and had some members of Year 3 take part. Mrs Rupp very kindly demonstrated the fife to us and played a few very famous pieces of music. We were then able to have a little workshop to see what it would be like to play the Fife! In science we explored everything to do with rocks. We got to investigate soil and were able to use microscopes to have a really good look.



Year 4

Year 4 have had a fun filled half-term and worked hard. One of their highlights was our trip to Bradgate Park, where they enjoyed bug hunting, river dipping and looking at the river features bringing to life topics they have been looking at in Science and Geography this term. They all behaved brilliantly, listened fantastically and made us very proud.



Year 5

This term has been a lovely term for Year 5. All of the children have settled in well and have worked hard throughout. A particular highlight was learning about the Kingdom of Benin across our topic subjects; we learnt about who the people of Benin were in History, sang African songs in Music, designed our own African djembe drums in D&T and even created out own Benin-inspired clay sculpture in art. Science has also been one of our favourite topics to learn about (and teach) this term; the children have all been so interested and many have done their own research at home too. We have also enjoyed off-timetable days, such as Roald Dahl Day and practising for the Poetry Slam. Year 5 have also been lucky enough to go on several trips this term too - such as an exciting Science Workshop at Lancaster Academy and an out -of-this-world day at the National Space Centre.



Year 6

What a busy Autumn term we have had in Year 6! The children were very inspired by our World War 1 topic in history, English and Art. They produced some amazing art work, wrote very moving poems, followed the journey of *Private Peaceful* and did some fantastic writing about the book. Our topic culminated in a special day where we tied up the topic with some online research, baking and art work based on the local war memorial.

We have also completed Bikeability training, First Aid, raised over £300 in enterprise week, and that's alongside lots of hard work in English and Maths! Well done Year 6 – enjoy a rest over the Christmas holidays!
